Coinciding with the Ozwater'10 Conference in Brisbane on 8-10 March 2010, the Australian and New Zealand Biosolids Partnership (ANZBP) is holding a free seminar to provide information on the sustainable management of biosolids in Australia and New Zealand. We are writing to invite you to this event.

The seminar will cover the Review of Biosolids Regulations in Australia and New Zealand recently completed by the Partnership, the review of Community Attitudes to the Management of Biosolids currently underway, and the future program of research being undertaken by the Partnership.

The seminar will be held at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre in Hospitality Room 2 (Foyer Level in Exhibition Hall 2) on Monday 8 March from 11.00 – 15.00.

For anyone who is not attending Ozwater'10, you can register as a trade visitor to attend the seminar at no cost, but you will need to collect a name badge at the registration desk to gain entry to the seminar. Participants in Ozwater'10 will be able to use their delegate name badge for entry.

The ANZBP is hosted by the Australian Water Association (AWA), and has three primary aims: to support public engagement with respect to the sustainable management of biosolids in both Australia and New Zealand; to support the Australian and New Zealand water industry on technical components of biosolids management; and to establish a global network of parties interested in the sustainable management of biosolids.

The sustainable management of biosolids is a complex and important task, and the Partnership seeks to unite the industry with a view to tackling projects and issues that would be difficult for any one organisation to address alone.
