Welcome to the seventh edition of the newsletter of the Australian and New Zealand Biosolids Partnership. The approaching close of the year presents the ideal opportunity to provide you with an update on the progress and activities of the ANZBP over the past few months.

Update on Key Projects

Community Attitudinal Survey

The Community Attitudinal Survey Report has been published and is currently being sent out to subscribers in hard copy. This report analyses the outcomes of a community survey process, which identified general community attitudes towards biosolids/ biosolids use. Some of the findings confirm the Industry's understanding of community attitudes, whereas many findings challenge what was previously believed. This report will play a strong role in informing the Communications Plan for the ANZBP.

Here are just a few of the findings:

• One third of all survey respondents had heard of the term biosolids, but of those, many could not define it, misunderstood the definition or focused on end use.

• A large majority of respondents (71%) were positive toward the use of biosolids for agriculture, domestic gardening and landscaping.

Respondents in rural areas are more likely to purchase foodstuffs grown on land where biosolids had been applied than
respondents from urban areas.

Literature Compendium

The ANZBP Biosolids Literature Compendium is now available online for subscribers. The Literature Compendium documents progress in biosolids management practices and research developments in Australia and New Zealand from the past 5 years, as well as planned research. The Compendium consists of a discussion paper which reviews the literature, and a searchable database which categorises the publications. The Compendium will be a valuable asset for researchers with technical matters to address, as well as a tool for policy and communications officers.

Biosolids Production and End Use Statistics

This project was undertaken to develop an accurate and comprehensive data-set of Biosolids Production and End Use for Australia and New Zealand. The data provided by WWTPs has been summarised in a report which is now available on the ANZBP Subscribers' website. Please note that the information has been aggregated to produce an overview of production on a national level and does not identify individual WWTP's. Thank you to all members who assisted this process by contributing data in a timely manner.

The ANZBP Advisory Board was pleased with the success of the 2009-10 Roadshows and has agreed that these events will be fixtures on the ANZBP calender in 2011. Presentations from the roadshow can be found on the public area of the ANZBP website, and you are welcome to share these with your colleagues, and others in the sector.

Engagement with Regulatory Bodies

The ANZBP Advisory Board met after the Roadshow in Perth and discussed a number of matters relating to the value of Regulator engagement. To acknowledge the current support from a number of Regulators and in recognition of the importance of engagement, particularly the role of providing a communications forum to explore regulatory consistency, the Board resolved to

establish a new annual fee rate for Regulators which is at the minimum level of ANZBP fees (\$1000.00).

Invoicing Arrangements

A number of organisations have requested that ANZBP assist internal financial operations by sending out subscription invoices at the beginning of the financial year, rather than mid-year as has been standard practice for the large majority of members in the past. In order to move towards this, subscription fee invoices for the current financial year will be sent out in January 2011 with invoices for 2011-12 then delivered in June 2011. Please remember to ensure that your fees are included in your future budgets!

Melbourne Water Issues Call for Expressions of Interest for Biosolids Research

The Melbourne Water Corporation, has issued a call for expressions of interest for research projects that will address the beneficial uses of biosolids. The call is open to suitably qualified and experienced research organizations or industry/research group partnerships who can propose and implement a credible research project focused on technologies to enhance the potential for beneficial use of biosolids by: energy, nutrient and/or metals extraction, decontamination, stabilization, or other conversion of biosolids (chemicals, fuels, etc.). Expression of interest submissions will be received up to 1:00 pm Australian EDT on Wednesday, February 2, 2011.

National Biosolids Partnership Webcast – Charting the Future of Biosolids Management:

The NBP is holding a webcast on January 26, 2011 from 2:00-3:30 pm EST (US) to discuss the findings from a recent facilitated forum that discussed current and future issues, drivers and trends associated with Biosolids Management. Trends and drivers that will be discussed include: public policy and regulations, technology, operation and management, outreach and training and research needs.

IWA-WEF has announced the IWA-WEF Nutrient Recovery and Management 2011 Conference which will be held in Miami, Florida, USA from January 9 - 12, 2011.

Topic areas to be discussed at the conference include:

- Research in Nutrient Removal and Recovery
- Operations of Nutrient Removal and Recovery Plant
- Design of Nutrient Removal and Recovery Plants Watershed and River Basin Nutrient Management
